Gospel Acclamation

The Gospel Acclamation is always sung. The Cantor introduces the "Alleluia." The Assembly repeats the "Alleluia." The Cantor then sings the verse selected from TOGETHER FOR LIFE. All then repeat the "Alleluia."

The Eucharistic Acclamations are always sung by the assembly. The acclamations are comprised of the HOLY, MYSTERY OF FAITH, and AMEN. At Saint Paul, we use the Eucharistic Acclamations from THE MASS OF THE RESURRECTION by Randall DeBruyn. If the people attending your wedding have a greater familiarity with another set of Eucharistic Acclamations, those should be used. Please inform us if this should be the case.

Communion Song

The Communion Song is sung as the assembly receives Communion. If you choose, the assembly may join the Cantor in this song. Simply include the hymnal number of the song in your program.
